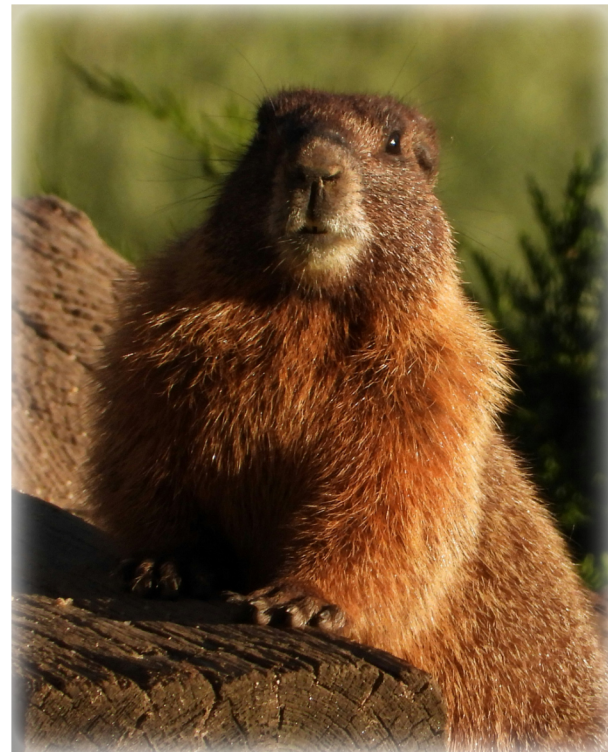

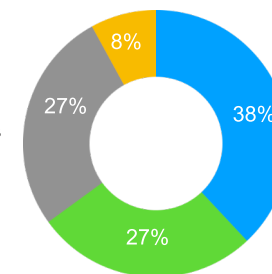

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

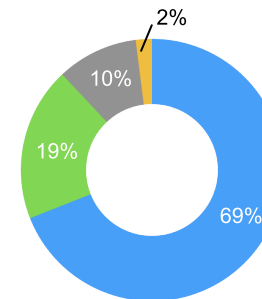
Sources of Funds: \$11,188,001
